## GONZO SHOW

HUNTER S THOMPSON IS REMEMBERED IN A COLLECTION OF ICONIC IMAGES

If Ralph Steadman's *The Joke's Over*, this autumn's memoir of the illustrator's chemically-enhanced collaborations with Hunter S Thompson, was the last word on the fast life and high times of that most storied of American journalists, then next month's *Gonzo* is the definitive coffee-table survey of his iconoclastic career.

Featuring photographs never before published of Thompson and by him, from his early days in Kentucky to his declining years in Colorado, it has an introduction by the Doctor's good friend Johnny Depp – who played him in Terry Gilliam's movie adaptation of his most famous book, *Fear And Loathing In Las Vegas* – as well as all manner of ephemera from his celebrated assignments.

An accompanying exhibition, to be held at London's Michael Hoppen Gallery in February, will display the best images from the book. **AB**
