**JON RAFMAN** (b. 1981) is a Montreal-based artist, filmmaker and essayist. He received his BA in literature and philosophy from McGill University in Montreal, QC (2004) and his MFA from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago in Chicago, IL (2008). Rafman has exhibited his works across the US, Canada, Italy, Sweden, Germany, France, Spain, the Netherlands, Japan and Russia, including recent exhibitions at Saatchi Gallery (London) and Zach Feuer Gallery (New York) and an upcoming group exhibition at the International Center of Photography (New York). Rafman's work has been featured in *Modern Painters*, *Frieze*, *Der Spiegel*, *Libération*, *The New York Times*, *The Guardian* and *Harper's Magazine*, and his solo exhibition at M+B was chosen as *ARTFORUM's* Critic's Pick. Jon Rafman lives and works in Montreal.



**JESSE STECKLOW** (b. 1993) is expected to receive his BA from the Design and Media Arts program from the University of California Los Angeles in 2014. His work has been exhibited in group exhibitions at Perry Rubenstein Gallery (Los Angeles), Favorite Goods (Los Angeles), New Gallery (Paris) and Still House (New York). Stecklow is a member of *Jogging* and is the co-founder of the design studio *Content is Relative*. Jesse Stecklow lives and works in Los Angeles.



**HANNAH WHITAKER** (b. 1980) received her BA from Yale University (2002) and MFA from ICP/Bard (2006). Recent exhibitions include solo shows at Galerie Christophe Gaillard (Paris), Thierry Goldberg (New York) and Locust Projects (Miami), along with group shows at Cherry and Martin (Los Angeles), Higher Pictures (New York), Tokyo Institute of Photography and Rencontres d'Arles in France, where she was nominated for the Discovery Prize. She recently co-edited Issue 45 of *Blind Spot* magazine and co-curated its accompanying show at Invisible Exports in New York. She is a contributing editor for *Triple Canopy*, a collective included in the 2014 Whitney Biennial. Hannah Whitaker lives and works in Brooklyn.
